Frequent Responses:

Is this a political call/I'm on the do not call list?

Answer: We wanted to check in to see how you are holding up. Normally I would be introducing myself in person but just wanted to share briefly about the campaign.....

I don't have time for this.

Answer: I understand. I will send you more information via the mail. Are you still at _____ address? [or try to get their email by saying I can send you info if you have a good email address as well]

I am concerned about the safety of the upcoming election.

Answer: We are too. I know Rhonda has been encouraging folks to call and email the Governor (573-751-3222) and Secretary of State (573-751-2301) to request they allow no excuse absentee voting.

District 31, is that my district?

Answer: Are you still at _____?

How did you get my number?

Answer: The state party provided this information to the campaign.

Hello. **May I please speak with _____?** [Confirm they are the voter on your list.]

Hi, my name is _____. I'm a volunteer for Rhonda Dolan who is running for House District 31. How are you holding up during this time? [Wait for them to respond]

Normally I would be knocking on doors in the district to talk to you face to face but since we can't right now, **do you still live at _____?**

[NO] — If they moved out of the district, thank them and hang up. If still in the district, write down their new address and move to the next question.

[YES] That's great.

Are you planning to vote in November?

[NO] I know it's still quite early, but voting this year is going to be very important, I hope you will reconsider. Thank you for your time and have a great day.

[YES or MAYBE] Great, as I said I'm a volunteer with Rhonda Dolan's campaign. She is running for State Representative here in Blue Springs. Today we're talking to voters about the issues they are most concerned about. **Are there specific issues that are important to you in this election?** *Take notes on your conversation! Mark ALL that apply.*

Can Rhonda count on your vote on November 3rd?

[NO] Thank you very much for your time. Have a good day.

[UNDECIDED] I understand that, I hope you'll consider Rhonda:

- As a mom & former teacher, Rhonda knows the importance of quality schools for families in Blue Springs.
- Rhonda believes we need a safe community with good paying jobs & accessible, affordable healthcare.
- Rhonda believes we must uphold the will of the people & promote a clean, ethical government.

[YES] *Confirm their contact information and let them know someone will be in touch about volunteer opportunities. Go to next question.*

[NO] Go to next question.

The campaign is holding several online events coming up, do you have a good email address that we could send you some more information on Rhonda?

[YES] Enter Email address

[NO] Go to next question.

Would you allow us to place a yard sign in your yard in support of Rhonda?

[YES] *Confirm their contact information and let them know someone will deliver their sign by June.* Thank you for your time today!

[NO] Thanks so much for your support and your time. Don't forget to vote for Rhonda November 3rd! Have a good day!

- Boundaries of the district - I-70 on the north, Colbern on the south, Adam's Dairy Rd on the east, Lake Jacomo to the west.
- Currently held by Republican Dan Stacy.
- Prop A(RTW) was voted down by 70.52%, Amendment 1 (Clean MO) - Passed by 69.95%,
- Med Marijuana - Passed by 71.48%, Prop B - Min Wage - Passed by 65%.
